## Department Information

### Performing Arts Department

#### DRAMA

The Y12 Drama Scholars/Enrichment are currently working on extracts from a Midsummer Night's Dream. We are exploring the use of Shakespeare's language and Stage combat.

This week the Drama department will be completing the GCSE Component 2 scripted exams. Students are working on extracts from professional published plays such as Two by Jim Cartwright and Mother figure by Alan Ayckborn. Students will be marked on their application of performing skills to realise artistic intentions, interpretation, and engagement to realise artistic intentions, contribution to the performance as a whole to realise artistic intentions. Historically our students have always performed very well in this component.

Additionally, the RSL students will also be completing their Live Performance exam this week. They have been given a theme set by the exam board and have devised a piece of theatre based around this theme using the techniques of a famous non-naturalistic theatre practitioner, Bertolt Brecht. Bertolt Brecht aimed to educate the audience on the meaning of performances rather than simply entertaining them with a piece of theatre. The students will demonstrate their performance skills and their ability to work collaboratively in a group whilst educating the audience on a current socio-political issue. We wish all students the best of luck for their performances.

#### MUSIC

This Wednesday we held the Piano Recital evening, the students were fantastic and a wonderful evening was had by all! Donations made on the evening will be going to the Red Cross to support the Ukraine crisis. The evening raised £138.00!

#### DANCE

There are so many exciting things happening in dance this year, a lot of these in relation to our recent partnership with CAST Academy. This year we have teamed up with a performing arts school who work with our KS5 Dance Scholars and students involved in Dance Enrichment. Most lessons are now held in their amazing dance studios fully equipped with mirrors, ballet bars, arial hoops and sprung mats to develop tricks and skills beyond our current curriculum.
