Sponsored Walk

Our annual sponsored walk will take place in school time on Friday 8 July 2022. The walk will cover approximately 6 miles, passing Hoober Stand, using public footpaths. The route will be fully marshalled by school staff and the Police, who will supervise at busy roads. The school expects all students to take part in the walk (within reason, taking into account all relevant information) and we hope as many as possible are able to be sponsored for their efforts.

Last year, the sponsored walk managed to raise almost £10,000 for Bluebell Wood. We were extremely proud of their efforts and hope our students can show similar enthusiasm. This year we are raising funds for a local project. Stevie Taylor, a Year 7 student in our academy, was diagnosed with CLN3 Batten disease in 2018. This is an extremely rare neurodegenerative condition that causes profound disability and devastating life changing effects. This is fast progressing and can cause a progressive loss of skills such as sight and the ability to walk, talk and swallow.

Stevie's family made the difficult decision to sell their family home and purchased a bungalow in an attempt to make Stevie's life easier and more comfortable. This will need to be totally renovated to meet Stevie's needs. We are keen to assist Stevie's family with raising funds for level access flooring, an accessible kitchen, a sensory room and other adaptations to make the home a safe one for Stevie. We also wanting to give a donation to the Batten Disease Family Association to help other families living with the same condition.

All students will be given a sponsor form in which they can gain sponsorship for completing the walk and any donation to these causes will be appreciated. Our preferred method for collecting sponsorship money is via ParentPay online but students can also bring collected money into reception, if needed, in the days after the event.






CAREERS CORNER

KS3 – CORE RELIGIOUS STUDIES

Students in CORE Religious Studies have continued to increase their knowledge and understanding of different world views whilst being encouraged to respond to significant questions about meaning. This has included:

Y7 students' study into Buddhism gave the fabulous opportunity for exploring spirituality through the arts. Students used origami to create a variety of lotus flowers to represent the Buddhist belief in the purity of the body, speech and mind, as if floating above the murky waters of material attachment and physical desire, while also demonstrating fully engaged oracy skills through wonderful presentations to the class.

Y8 students have begun reflecting on the natural world and why it creates feelings of 'Awe and Wonder', exploring the final topic of Awe and Wonder', using specific examples ranging from our own fingerprints to images of wildlife which some students may not have previously had access or have not been given the opportunity to fully reflect on their experiences.

Y9 students have investigated specific examples of stewardship from a range of religious and non-religious communities, together with action groups leading to an analysis of how it can lead to communal harmony inspiring students to be global citizens in the pursuit to protect the natural world for future generations.





KS4 – SOCIOLOGY

Year 10 - Students in Y10 have been completing work on the 'Education' unit recently exploring exciting topics such as 'why do girls do better than boys in education' and 'is it home factors or factors within school that have the most impact on how well you do in school?' Students have been busy preparing for their second trial which Miss Cooke is looking forwarding to marking!

Year 11 - Our Year 11 students have recently successfully completed their GCSE Sociology exams. The students worked incredibly hard preparing for these exams. The department would like to congratulate Y11 on their commitment and dedication to these exams and wish them every luck and success for their next steps.
