### **Success Stories**

Katie Battle recently made the finals of the 800m and 1500m indoor northern athletics track and field championships, securing personal best times in both events and winning a Silver medal in the 1500m. Katie secured qualifying times for both the National and English Schools Track & Field Championships.

Katie also won the South Yorkshire Cross Country League and won a silver medal at the South Yorkshire Championships.

She won silver in the South Yorkshire Schools Cross Country Championships and has now been selected to represent South Yorkshire Schools at the **English Schools National Cross Country** Championships at Nottingham later this month.

In addition to her individual achievements Katie and her Rotherham Harriers & Athletics Club Team mates have enjoyed success in team cross country championship races recently. They won gold and were crowned champions at the recent Northern Cross Country Championships in Blackburn running against clubs from the North of England. They topped this off with an outstanding win and gold medals at the Saucony English National Cross Country Championships in Chester where they were crowned national champions running against clubs from across the whole of England.

## **Toilets**

I wanted to write to parents to provide some clarity around the use of toilets during the school day. I'm aware of some recent unhelpful rumours on social media which are simply untrue, so I wanted to share with parents/carers the rationale behind our systems.

Students are encouraged to use the toilets before school, at break time, at lunch time and after school in order to reduce the need to go to the toilet during lesson time. The reason for this is that we want to minimise the disruption to learning time. If a student genuinely needs the toilet, they are of course, permitted to go. Unfortunately, we do have some students who take advantage of this and waste their own and others learning time.

When a student goes to the toilet during lesson time, they are picked up by a member of staff on 'active support' and escorted to the toilet blocks. The reasons for this are below:

- We can monitor who is in toilets to ensure they remain a safe space and they are used appropriately
- We can ensure groups of students aren't gathering in the toilets
- It reduces the amount of damage in toilets (on occasion there have been instances of damage to toilets)
- It prevents students from being able to vape in toilets.

Eliminating some of the risks above mean that we can appropriately safeguard our students.

When the toilets are not in use they are locked. They are then unlocked when a member of staff walks a student to the toilet. I am aware of rumours that the toilets are locked all day, this is simply not the case. They are only locked when they are not in use. They are also unlocked before school, break and lunch times. The rationale for this is below:

- Using this system, we are always aware of who is in the toilet meaning they remain a safe space
- Students don't have the opportunity to truant lessons in the toilets (we have next to no truancy issues at the academy – this system is a large contributing factor)
- It reduces the amount of damage in toilets
- It prevents students from being able to vape in the toilets.



When students go to the toilet, we scan their ID cards. The rationale for this is below:

- This is to identify patterns, for example, individual students using the toilets during certain subjects or times during the day
- To keep a track of which students are taking advantage of the system
- By identifying those who use the system inappropriately, we are able to reduce toilet use for those who don't actually need to go, therefore making it easier for students who genuinely need to access the toilets.

We provide a staff presence around the toilet blocks at social times and we only let in the same number of students as toilets cubicles available (if there are 6 toilets cubicles then only 6 students will be allowed in at one time). The rationale for this is:

- To keep the toilets a safe space
- To reduce damage
- To prevent students from vaping
- To ensure the toilets don't become an intimidating place for students to enter
- To ensure students leave the toilets when finished to allow for other students to use them.

Behind every decision we make at the academy, we have the best interests of the students at heart. Toilet use, damage and disruptive behaviour in toilets is a national issue, something many schools are struggling with. Our systems allow for the toilets at Wath Academy to remain a safe space for students, which for us, is the most important thing.

I hope I have managed to provide some further clarity around our systems. I would also like to offer the opportunity for any parent or carer to have a tour of the Academy to see all our systems in action and experience our high standards and excellent learning environment.
