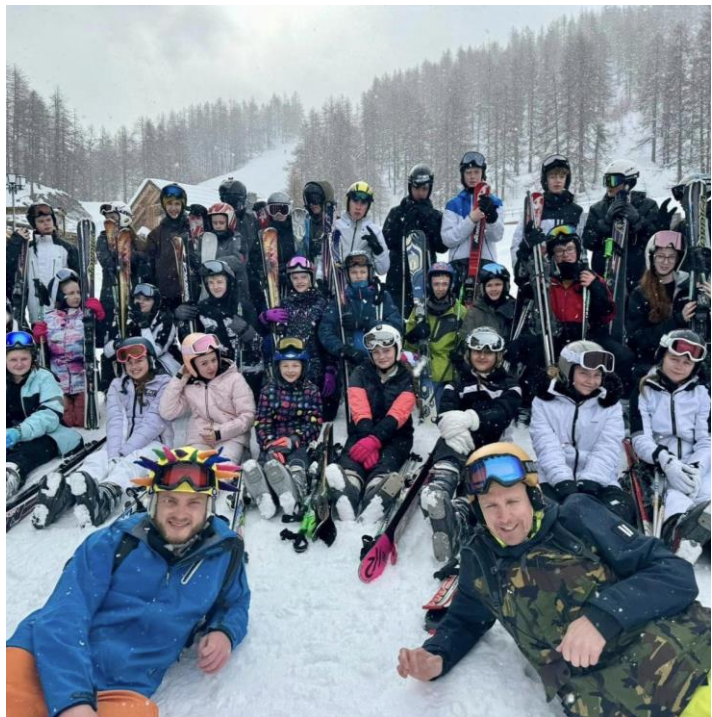
Ski visit – Sauze d’oulx, Italy
