

Tourette Syndrome Tips for Teachers

- 1. Short, simple and clear instructions.
- 2. Time. Be patient and give the child time to focus and produce.
- 3. Movement is key to these children's learning. Don't insist on sitting at a table with a pen for the whole task. Make it as interactive as possible.
- 4. Breaks need to be frequent.
- 5. Understand that Short bursts of work may be the key to success.
- 6. Handwriting is not a sign of intelligence. If it's not a handwriting or spelling assessment then scribe for the child to let their creativity flow.
- 7. Provide an area for time out where child can feel comfortable to go if things get too much.
- 8. Allow tics and don't tell off. And don't expect the child to be able to concentrate on what you are saying whilst they are ticcing.
- 9. Never punish a TS child for not completing work and never make them stay behind to finish work especially not to let them miss their play!
- 10. Support child in explaining tics to peers so they fully understand that they too are 'normal' children.
